



FAO-ISESCO Sub-Regional Workshop on Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS) for West Africa 28, 29, 30 June 2016 Hotel Atlas Asni Marrakesh, Morocco

Background note

The **Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS)**¹ is an FAO programme that aims to identify, support and safeguard Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems and their livelihoods, agricultural and associated biodiversity, landscapes, knowledge systems and cultures around the world.

Over the past decade, the GIAHS Initiative has been piloting an innovative model of engaging communities, local and national governments in the adaptive management of agricultural heritage and conservation of systems' goods and services. It has served as a learning laboratory for identifying new ways to sustain nature's bounty, the health of ecosystems, conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity and genetic resources for food and agriculture, protection of traditional knowledge systems, culture, and more importantly, building a bridge for the sustainable future.

In November 2011, FAO and Islamic Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ISESCO) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), a framework of partnership agreement. The MOU reflects the commitment of both organizations to promote cooperation and develop their capacities to protect agricultural heritage, promote the diversity of culture and cultural expressions, further develop their communication platform, institutional capacity and policies, and promote an exchange of activities and services.

Following the signing of the MOU, in May 2012, an international workshop on GIAHS for the Islamic countries was held in Rabat to launch GIAHS with ISESCO member states which coincided at ISESCO Annual Convention.

With this background, an international workshop on GIAHS was held in FAO in November 2014 with the aim of launching the Initiative and enhancing understanding on the values of the Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems among the attendees from Islamic countries. In June 2015, in response to the request from the Government of Mauritania, the joint workshop was held in Mauritania to establish a national GIAHS Committee towards the promotion of GIAHS in the country. In the recent days, more and more countries in the region (members and non-members of ISESCO) are establishing GIAHS and are submitting proposals to FAO.

Objectives of the Workshop

The general objective of this joint workshop is to promote GIAHS dissemination and enhance the capacity of the West African countries to identify and propose their GIAHS sites. The specific objectives are as follows:

- To familiarize representatives of West African countries with the origin, background and concept of GIAHS, the fundamental values of agricultural heritage, and opportunities for collaboration;
- To share knowledge, experiences and lessons learned by outstanding examples of GIAHS in Africa (GIAHS holding countries like Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Kenya) on the coordination of all the relevant stakeholders including local communities, planning and implementation of dynamic conservation of the GIAHS sites;
- To prepare an action plan to promote GIAHS in West-Africa Region
